About The Author



A retired classroom teacher who majored in English and Children's Literature, Susea spent 23 years making literacy learning fun for her young students. Her favourite time of day was sitting down with a book or two and immersing her students in the world of storytelling.

Susea has always written in one form or another. A decade ago, she and her husband commenced on an around the world sailing odyssey. Their travels were recorded on Susea's sailing blog.

As she documented the sailing journey, notes and ideas for children's picture books were taking form. At long last Susea had found her passion and a voice. She now shares her love of language, sailing and sea with young and old through the eyes of a big blue boat and a young girl - her Captain.

Susea's first book *A Big Blue Boat*, was released in March 2022. A 2023 Purple Dragonfly Award winner, 2022 Literary Titan Silver Award Winner, 2022 book finalist in the Page Turner Awards, and a 2021 Page Turner Awards writing finalist. *A Big Blue Boat* is the first in the series. Based upon Susea's adventures, the book fills the niche market of realistic sailing stories for young children, particularly girls.

The first sequel about life on the brine was Children's Picture Book Genre Winner and shortlisted in the 2023 Page Turner Awards. It's currently being illustrated by Australian illustrator, Emma Stuart, and is due for release in late 2024.

In her spare time, Susea also loves to research, cook, photograph, quilt, embroider, walk, and work on her sailing blog.

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
The Book

What are a Big Blue Boat and her brave Captain going to do? Will they find a safe harbour in time?

Early readers just love joining in with the fun wording, rhythm, rhyme and repetition that generate strong imagery in this award-winning story about a boat, a girl and the sea.



It even has a glossary and an activity to do!

If you love Hairy Maclary, The Gruffalo and There Was an Old Lady, you are going to love A Big Blue Boat!

In a world where sailing stories are still very much written for boys, *A Big Blue Boat* also highlights to girls that they too, can dream big and set sail – and they learn a little bit about sailing boats.

The Visit

Suitable for ages 18 months - 12 years

In addition to sharing my book with the children and parents, my visit introduces to them the adventure that led to my writing of the 'A Big Blue Boat' books.

The session includes:

 The use of a map and imagery that introduces them to a sailing journey where they learn about rare and extinct animals, ocean life, and the life people on remote islands lead.



- The reading which includes learning the actions for the story and parts of a boat.
- Children and parents are encouraged to join in as I read.
- Children making a boat.
- Q&A
- All activity materials are provided by the author.
